THE PRINCIPLES OF THE PRINCIPAL



Dear Parents,

Love is in the air. Valentine's Day is on the horizon, and your children are busily creating hearts, preparing for their class parties, and of course, learning about the true meaning of love. When all is said and done about the various types of love touted: brotherly love, romantic love, familial love, or agape (unconditional love), the fact remains that love ultimately is an action and not simply a feeling of affection.

Many people love the idea of "being in love," but when things don't work out quite the way they imagined they would, they discount the relationship with, "I really wasn't in love after all" or "I just don't feel the love anymore." Both statements are sentimental at best, and self-centered at worst. Humans tend to get involved in relationships that benefit them personally. This is true of probably everything we endeavor or purchase as well. If you don't think so, just listen to a really good salesman who will sell you their product by specifically telling you how you are going to benefit by buying it, whether you need it or not. "True love" is not simply sentimental or self-serving.

Jesus came to this earth to teach us about His Father's Kingdom, as well as to provide a way of salvation to those who have fallen away from following Him. So what is His Father's Kingdom like? Jesus begins with a description of the very nature of God. He shares with us that, "God is love." (I John 4:8) He tells us that the primary thing that God desires from us is to love Him with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength. (Mark 12:30) He then goes on to say that the second most important thing to do is love others as we love ourselves. (Mark 12:31) He even gives us a description of what love is: "Love is patient and love is kind" (I Cor. 13:4.) And, he tells us what love is not: "It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, and it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, and always perseveres. Love never fails." (I Cor. 13:4-8) If you take a close look at this description, you will find that it is a list of "actions" which reflect our love, or lack of love for one another.

Ultimately, Jesus brings God-clarity to the scriptures and gives human beings the true standard for demonstrating love, both toward God and others. Love is not simply a feeling of affection, or a thought, or a romantic notion on Valentine's Day. True love is a commitment to always treat others as God treats us-unconditionally, with patience and kindness. Jesus also makes it clear, that we are even to do this with those who are difficult to love, and it is this action that will make Christians stand out in the world:

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even the pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."
(Matt. 5:43-48)

Hello Dear Parents,

The winds and cold have been quite strong, and your support and collaboration to ensure the children are warmly dressed and enjoy their time at the park have been a success. Thank you very much! It has been delightful to work as a team, and your tremendous support is truly appreciated. We also enjoy keeping you informed in writing, with photographs, and videos showcasing the achievements and activities in the 2-Year-Olds' class, where your children are the main protagonists.

In January, we explored the unit entitled "Outside My Window." The children learned that it is very cold, and therefore, they need to be well bundled up. We discussed how in other places, there is snow and different animals like, penguins and polar bears, which we created using our hands, feet, and colorful cardboard.

We also had the opportunity to speak with each of you about the achievements, areas for growth, and other aspects of each child in the 2-year-old class. We appreciate your honesty, open dialogue, and unconditional support regarding the challenges we've started; such as handwashing at the faucet and beginning toilet training—a crucial step for promotion to the 3-Year-Olds' class. Similarly, we will continue to reinforce the process of eating independently and drinking from a cup. The work you do at home is fundamental for the learning initiated in the classroom for them to continue to thrive and grow.

We celebrated the 100th day of classes with great enthusiasm. We began with the project of little sheep on T-shirts, painting, dressing each one with cotton flakes, and producing the sounds of sheep. On Tuesday, the celebration was grand; we wore our T-shirts and were well-wrapped up, despite the strong wind. We counted 10 snacks each until we reached 100, and there were many treats in our trail mix bags, but we couldn't eat them all! The celebration continued on the playground, where we joined all the students and played until we were exhausted. We used colored chalk to draw, hula-hooped without touching the edges, played with beanbags, played colorful hopscotch with large numbers, and fulfilled our dream of doing a lot of exercising with the coach. We jumped rope and returned to the classroom, very happy and tired. What a day of celebration!

We are preparing to start new projects, one of which is the unit titled: "My Community has Helpers" about doctors, firefighters, gardeners, dentists, mail carriers, chefs, police officers, librarians, and more. We will have some guests in the class to tell us about their work in the community. If you are one of them, please come and share what you do. Each child will dress up as a community helper to play the roles. On February 14, we will celebrate Valentine's Day with a class party where we will share presents with our classmates.

The biblical theme for this month is "Jesus Loves Me." Our verse is **1 John 3:23, "Let us love one another,"**

Each activity will remind us to emphasize the love, affection, and responsibility that should dominate our interactions with others. We will also read various biblical texts that teach about God's love through people who understood this great commandment: to love unconditionally. We will read 1 Samuel 16: 18-20, about the life of King David; and Judges 16, Jonah 1. Daniel 1 and 2, where we are invited to stand firm in God's army. As well as Luke 10 and 19, where it tells us how Jesus loves the children. The invitation is to read at home and talk with them about the love and respect we should have for God and one another.

Congratulations to the Student of the Month: Lucas Burriel, who happily shares with all the children in activities and games, and proactively helps with tidying up, cleaning, and organizing. 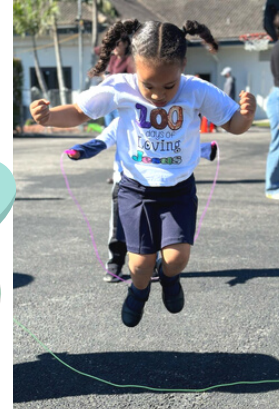

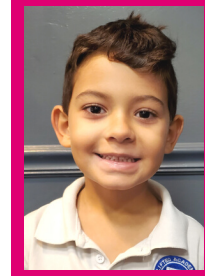

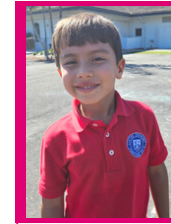

Please try to be punctual and present every day, as learning starts immediately after pledges. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out to me.

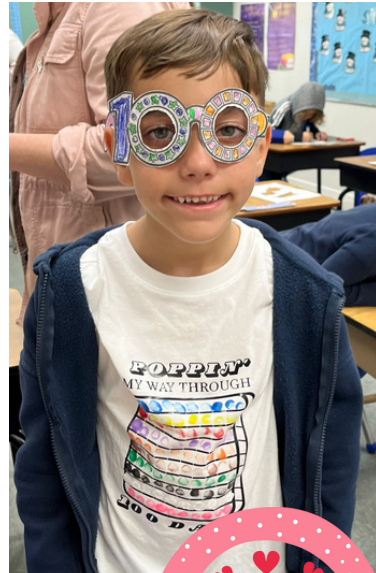

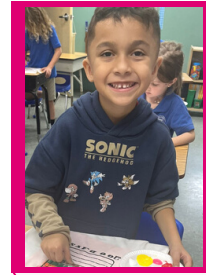

Hello parents,

What an amazing month January has been. This month seemed to go by faster than usual. The children had fun this month “poppin” their way through 100 days! I had a great time watching the children enjoy themselves in all of our different “100-day” activities. We also completed the second quarter of the school year and I am so glad I had the chance to sit with each of you, one-on-one, to discuss your child’s progress. They are all remarkable children, and I am truly blessed to be able to teach each one of them. The children also had fun supporting our fundraiser by purchasing popsicles and other goodies, as well as dressing up for Wacky Wednesday. Thank you all for supporting our school with your purchases. Now that we have reminisced on all of the fun things we did last month, let’s look at what the children did academically.

In Phonics and English, we reviewed our long and short vowel sounds and we learned how to identify if the letter y is being used as a consonant or a vowel. We also learned about topic sentences and detail sentences and how to differentiate the two. We also learned how to compose a paragraph using both types of sentences. For Math, we learned about fractions and using the terms: halves, fourths, and quarters. For Science, we learned about the different parts of our bodies and what their function is. We also learned that God created people to survive and grow.

In Heritage Studies we began to learn all about our land and what people can do to take care of it. We have also learned about the five oceans and the seven continents. continue to work on writing and how to compose proper paragraphs.

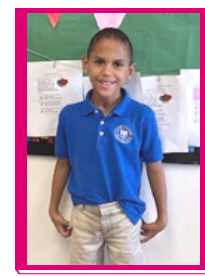
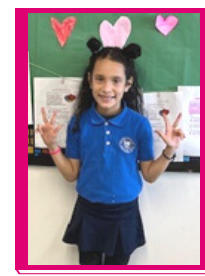

Dear Parents,

What better way to end our month than with our 100 Days of School celebration? The students enjoyed doing their shirts for the 100-day event. The students also got to do many fun, hands-on, interactive activities that day.

Last month we also celebrated our honor awards ceremony. It was very nice to see you all that day celebrating your children's achievements. I am very proud of all my students' progress this semester. Thank you, parents, for all of your support and dedication that you have given your child these last nine weeks.

January was a memorable month regarding our students' learning too. The students got to learn about topic sentences, details, and ending sentences. The students also got to learn about "Measurement" by solving word problems using a ruler and tape. The students learned to identify the length and height of an object. By reading Bible stories, the students enjoyed lessons on "A Servant Heart." Using lectures, activities, and watching stories the students learned many different ways to serve Jesus.

In February, the students will have a Valentine's project where the students will make a valentines box. We will also have a seven continents project where your child will create continents using recycled materials.

During these third nine weeks, my students will be learning how to create their own stories. I started giving them writing prompts to encourage them to write more and to use their critical thinking skills. They are already getting used to the routine of writing about the topic. They are assigned brainstorming steps first and then following the steps in writing a paragraph.

The students will also be working on improving their reading comprehension. We will be reading a novel in class to practice fluency and comprehension with our novel. We will have class discussions on the setting, characters, and events in the story. My recommendation for these nine weeks is to practice reading at home every night for more than 20 minutes and for students to highlight important events that are happening in the story. Also, the parents can ask questions while your child or you, read the chapter book.

In Math, the class will also learn about "Place Value: 3-Digit Numbers", using models and manipulatives. At home, I recommend using flashcards, visuals charts, or manipulatives to review place value.

In Bible, the students will learn all about "A Courageous Heart" with

stories such as "God Loved and Cared for the Three Men: Samson, Jonah".

Our Student of the Month is Kaylana Munoz. She is always eager to learn new concepts. Kaylana loves helping her teammates in activities. She is very kind and loves to participate in class. She is consistent and shows respect for both her peers and her teacher. Her disposition and manners always impress me. She's kind and considerate to all the students. It's an honor to have you in my classroom.

Our Star Student is Joshua Lindo. He is generous to his classmates. He comes to class prepared and ready to learn. He always has a positive and kind attitude towards his peers. Joshua's presence creates a fun and sweet atmosphere that's valuable. Kaylana and Joshua have both shown the godly character traits of love and caring for their classmates.
