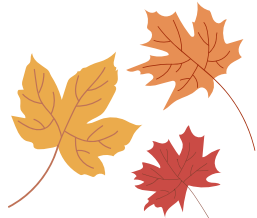

Dear families,

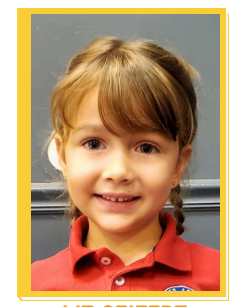

The theme this month is "Seasons All Around Us". There are several topics we will cover within our subject areas. In Language and Literacy we will be studying beginning sounds, letters "Uu," "Yy," and "Ww," sequencing of a story, drawing conclusions, categorizing, predicting, describing similarities and differences, identifying specific vocabulary content, and continuing to practice independent writing skills such as letters, words and proper names.

In Math: we will continue working on counting numbers 1 - 10, recognizing numbers 8 - 10, and building sets 6-10. In Social Emotional/Content: we will review classroom/playground rules and routines. We will also do exercises that will increase sharing, cooperation and taking turns with peers. In Fine Arts: continue creating original art works, singing a variety of simple songs, and using language as part of our dramatic play.

In Bible Time, we will be learning the stories of: "Abraham's Faith and Trust in God" and "The Gift of Isaac," "Jacob and Esau," "Joseph's Multicolored Coat," "The Pilgrims Obey God and Give Thanks," and "Joseph Gives Thanks for God's Provisions." 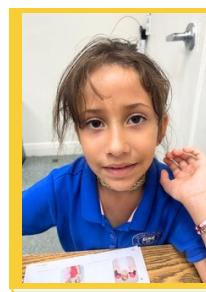
Hello parents,

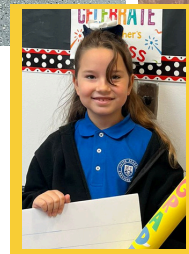

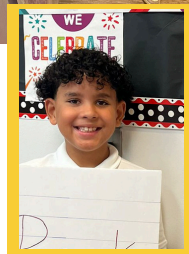

Hello parents,



October has been a wonderful and exciting month! I truly enjoyed seeing all my students participate in the Fall Festival, where they had a great time with outdoor games and activities. The first nine weeks have been impressive; I'm proud of each student for their hard work across all subjects! This month, we've introduced essential new concepts across our subjects and also focused on character traits such as justice, honesty, integrity, and trust/faith through fun, interactive activities. Phonics and English: We practiced writing structured paragraphs and explored verbs in the past, present, and future tenses. Math: The students worked diligently on their multiplication tables and enjoyed using manipulatives to solve problems.

Bible Studies: Our lessons this month centered around the theme "How to Pray," encouraging reflection and understanding. Math: Students will start working on multiplication with models and manipulatives for a stronger foundational understanding. Science: Our theme will be "How Matter Moves," and we'll conduct STEAM experiments to bring this concept to life. Heritage Studies: We'll discuss cells, tissues, organs, and systems through readings and class discussions. Bible Studies: This month's focus is "A Humble Heart," reminding us there is only one God.

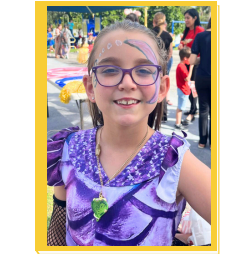

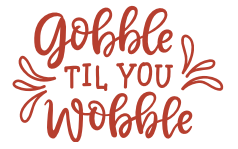
