Spring is upon us! It is this type of weather that makes everyone want to move to Florida. I personally love spring as it reminds us of the great hope that lies within us. In the same way the new life springs up after the dead of winter, so too our souls are given a second chance despite our past sins, when we give our hearts and lives to Jesus Christ.

Next month, we celebrate the Passover and Easter as we proclaim that Jesus is alive. We serve the God of second chances. However, this awareness of hope is not always realized in our world. Consequently, there is much darkness and strife among within our culture. But this is also the reason why Christian education is so very important in the lives of our children.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. stated, "The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically. Intelligence plus character- that is the goal of true education." As a Baptist minister and a civil rights advocate, he knew exactly what was needed for real change to occur in the lives of people, both individually and within community. He also knew that real character development in the life of a child comes through emulating role models that exhibit and teach the true nature of God.

When we celebrate Easter next month, we celebrate the fact that there is no greater role model who completely and utterly reflects the nature and heart of God, our Father, except His Son, Jesus Christ. He is perfect, and perfectly gave Himself up for us all as an act of true love and compassion for all people. He is the role model that we want our children to follow.

The fact is that all children are born with the proclivity to sin. In short, we all make mistakes and are full of pride. I have seen over the last 37 years of my tenure working in schools, that children do not have to be taught to be self-centered. From birth, their natural desire is to survive and to protect all that they feel is their very own. Compassion and the ability to care about others is something that needs to be taught. To teach them is to train them how to think critically and solve problems from a biblical worldview. The principles found in God's Word teach our children how to love unselfishly a love which does not seek to get, but rather to give. It is Jesus who teaches us to care, despite the adverse actions of others against us. He teaches us to forgive, despite unforgiving and mean people who will cross our paths in this life. This is a very different viewpoint than the world.

We all have a choice: we can either follow the way of Christ and His truth, as outlined in the Bible, or not. But there are consequences to our choices. The apostle Paul shared it this way:

**“Do not be deceived, God is not mocked, whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.
(Galatians 6:7)**

This is called the law of sowing and reaping. In other words, all of our choices have consequences. We can either follow God's ways, and in turn teach our children the same, or not. Jesus said, at the end of His Sermon on the Mount, that if we do act on His words we will be blessed and solid in our faith and in our lives. But, IF we do not, we will find ourselves living on “sinking sand”; and when the storms of life come we will fail miserably.

The ability to reason well in light of God's perspective, and to develop a character of love and forgiveness, is possible. But we must be intentional both in our own lives and in the lives of our children.

This is why placing your child in a good Christian school and church throughout their lives is so very necessary. You do not want to leave the academic education and character development of your child up to chance. You will reap in your children what you sow into them! When you do, you will eventually fulfill Dr. King's final wish for his own family:

“I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character.”

This dream cannot be fulfilled apart from the intentional teaching of children about the character and nature of Jesus Christ. We must teach our children to follow Him and put Him first in their lives. When we do, Dr. King's dream will become a reality.

May God bless each of our families here at Lifted Academy, as together we seek to train up the character of each of these little ones that you all have placed in our care. It is our goal to train up a new generation of leaders that will one day influence the world for Christ. We feel so privileged that you have placed your children here at Lifted Academy. We all appreciate the fact that so many of you have been here since your students were preschoolers. Consequently, we are almost at full enrollment for next year, we only have a few spots left. If you have not reserved your spot for next year, you will want to do so as soon as possible. I want to personally thank many of you for recommending our school to other parents as well. May God continue to bless all of you and your families; and may God continue to bless Lifted Academy in the coming years as we grow together to further His Kingdom purposes in our community.

- Week 1: King David's Life as a Boy (1 Samuel 16:14-23; 17:1; 18:1-4; 18:10; 19-20; 23:16-18; 2 Samuel 1)
- Week 2: God Loved and Cared for Three Men: Samson, Jonah, Daniel & Friends (Judges 16:1-31; Jonah 1:1-17; Daniel 1:6-21)
- Week 3: The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)
- Week 4: Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-9)

In addition to our Bible lessons, we explored Unit 13: I Can Express My Feelings and Unit 16: I See Changes in the Weather. We focused on learning the numbers eleven and twelve, as well as the letters Mm, Nn, and Oo. The children also recognized the heart and star shapes, and the colors pink, red, and purple.

February was a month full of love! Thank you to the parents who attended our Open House/Ice Cream Social. It was wonderful to chat with you about your child's progress and share our plans for next school year. It was also lovely to meet some of the parents from Mrs. Myriam's class—we look forward to having you join Pre K -3 next school year. We also celebrated Valentine's Day right here at school! The kids made cards for their friends, participated in a Valentine's goodie bag exchange, and recognized that Jesus' sacrifice on the cross was the ultimate demonstration of love. - Week 3: The Healing of the Paralytic (Matthew 9:1-8; Mark 2:1-12; Luke 5:12-16)

In addition to these Bible stories, we will work through Unit 17: Pets Need Care, Unit 18: The Farmer Helps Me, and Unit 19: Animals Live in Homes, Too. The letters we will be focusing on are Pp, Qq, and Rr, along with the colors black and gray. We will also review the numbers 1, 2, and 3, as well as the oval and circle shapes.

As always, we encourage you to reinforce the topics covered in class with your child at home. Simple activities, discussions, and reading together can greatly enhance their learning experience and make these lessons even more meaningful.

Looking Ahead

This month, we will start with the theme "Let's Move."

- Expression of the Arts: The children will continue working on artistic expression through dramatic play, role-playing, and dance. They will also spend time crafting with colors and different materials.
- Reading: The children will work on new phonemes, review sight words, and continue learning new ones. They will enjoy reading exciting stories. As their teacher, I will focus on helping them retell important facts and story elements while emphasizing the difference between real and make-believe stories.
- Writing: The children will focus on letter names and shapes, specifically Jj, Hh, and Ii.
- Math: The children will learn to understand and describe positions, use terms for time, categorize time intervals, and compare size, amount, and weight. They will also learn to follow a step-by-step plan to solve problems.
- Science: The children will learn about the sun, moon, and stars and understand how objects, animals, and people move and make sounds.
- Bible Time: We will be learning the stories:
 - "Jesus Goes to Church / Jesus Demonstrates Obedience"
 - "Jesus is Baptized / Jesus Calls His Disciples to be Fishers of Men"
 - "The Story of the Lost Sheep / The Prodigal Son"
 - "Jesus is King"

Our Star Student of the Month: Giana Cedo!

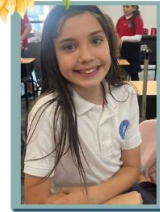
Giana is a generous and hardworking student who comes to class prepared and ready to learn. She loves participating and supporting her classmates, always showing kindness and care.
