Dear Parents,

As we approach the next school year, it is crucial to consider the significance of re-enrollment at Lifted Academy. 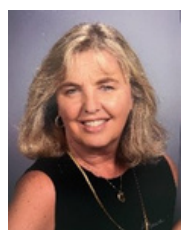

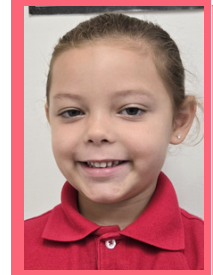

Looking Ahead

During this month, the theme will be: "In the City, In the Country". In Reading, the children will continue with phonemes, and will begin to match words with the same beginning sounds. They will also be learning new sight words and continue to read new stories in class.

In Writing, the children will focus on the letters Cc, Qq, Vv, and on the sounds they make. We will teach them new words related to the theme to expand their vocabulary.

In Expression of the Arts, the children will be working on a variety of skills related to their needs and the theme. We will also be focusing on art using different colors, textures, and shapes. The children will create original work, form, and meaning.

In Math, we will work on problem solving, money, weight, and capacity.

In Social Studies, we will explore the ways that people live, work and play, and how these ways have changed over time. Also, we will study how people create food, clothing, and shelter from natural resources in order for all of us to consume them.

In Science, we will be observing and experimenting with the motion of objects and simple machines. We will also work on identifying what things are made out of.

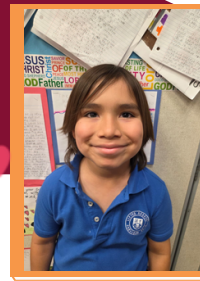

Dear Families,

January has been a busy and exciting month in our 3rd-grade class. Students returned from break refreshed and eager to learn. Throughout the month, students studied God's Word with lessons emphasizing biblical truth, obedience, and Christ-like character. We discussed how God's wisdom is revealed in His Word and how we can apply biblical principles in daily life.

In reading, using the Bob Jones Reading curriculum, students practiced reading comprehension, identifying main ideas and details, and vocabulary development. Students also met in small groups for targeted instruction focusing on fluency, comprehension strategies, and building reading confidence.

In language arts, students worked on grammar, parts of speech, capitalization, punctuation, and writing complete sentences. Writing activities included sentence expansion, creative writing responses, and using descriptive language. In math, students focused on learning multiplication facts, understanding multiplication as repeated addition, practicing math strategies, and solving word problems.

In science, students explored God's creation through a biblical worldview, learning the difference between a biblical worldview and a secular worldview. As part of a hands-on science experiment, students made snow using baking soda and observed changes in texture and temperature while practicing scientific observation skills. In social studies, students learned about communities, citizenship, map skills, and the roles and responsibilities of citizens.

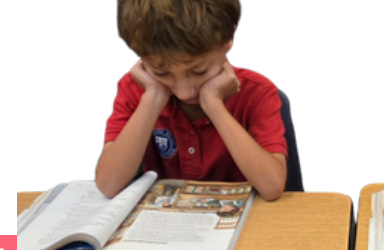
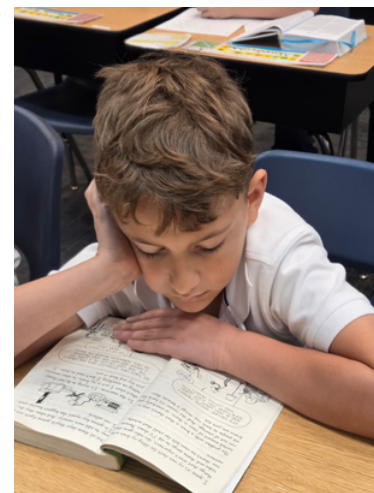
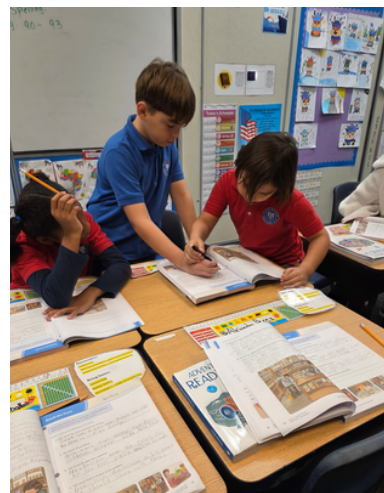
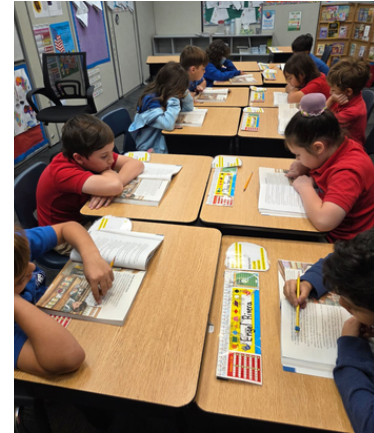
